Collaborative learning spaces, state-of-the-art science labs and video amphitheaters are common.

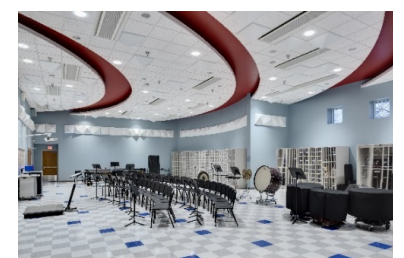
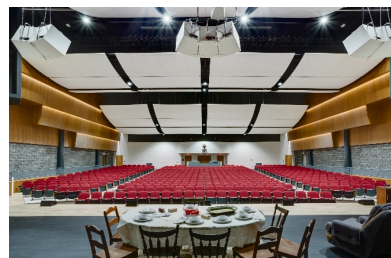


Modern art studios, television/radio production facilities, culinary arts, automotive/manufacturing, and biology programs prepare students for a variety of careers.

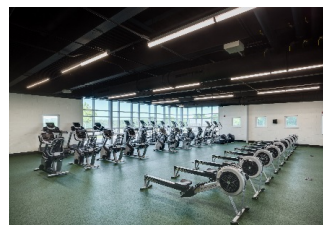
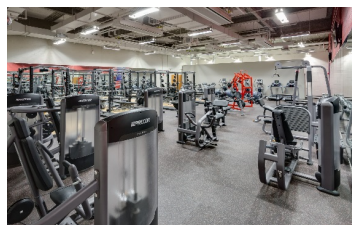
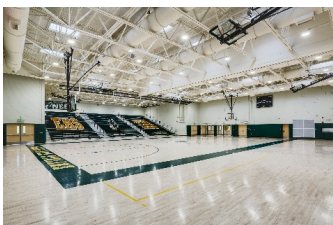


Cafeterias feature modern kitchens and social seating arrangements.
